The staff at Fraser Park Preschool-7 School have been demonstrating life long learning by updating their skills in Literacy on our Student Free Day. Eddie Pollard (Consultant) ran a workshop on Accelerated Literacy which recapped the teaching cycle of scaffolded literacy. Teachers had the chance to share ideas and to improve their literacy practice. By having all staff attend training we developed a common understanding of literacy at Fraser Park Preschool-7 School.



We have also been working with Sue Record (Regional Principal Consultant), looking at behaviour profiling. This program looks at good practice in classroom management and gives Staff a range of ideas to apply in classrooms to help them run smoothly and increase engagement in learning.

Pulyeri with Mr. Hill are studying the classic narrative, **The Very Hungry Caterpillar** by Eric Carle.




Kungari with Mrs. Schutz are studying a scientific report, **The Rainbow Lorikeet** by M. Justice and A. Porter.




During the week some school children came over and helped the children be gentle with our chickens, *Henny, Penny* and *Chantelle*.
