Wellbeing Coordinator

At Fraser Park we have been working on improving the Oral Language skills of all students from Pre-School to year 7 with a focus on building students vocabulary. Teachers have been working with Paula Fahey the Accelerated Literacy focus teacher to develop Play Boxes and Word Walls with Tier 1 and Tier 2 words to improve all students vocabulary. The play boxes are designed around a theme such as cooking and students are explicitly taught the Tier 2 words that go with the kit. The students then play with the kits and use those words in their play supporting improved vocabulary.

The teachers will also work with Ms Fahey to pick out Tier 2 words from their Accelerated Literacy Text and put them on their Word Walls in class. The students are explicitly taught these words and given the opportunity to use them in a variety of settings. The teachers will be sending these words home with students to practise as part of their homework. The students will be tested on these words at the beginning of the term and at the end of the term to track their progress. This will be supporting the work that teachers are doing with the 500 Oxford Sight words.
