

We have also shared the story of Ngarrindjeri from Ngarrindjeri Dreaming Stories. This is one of the titles in our Ngarrindjeri Persona Doll Packs. The story begins by explaining what happened when Ngarrindjeri saw Pondi, the giant Murray Cod and began to chase him down stream. *Ask your child if they can tell you about Pondi*
