To increase students achievement in writing in the Primary Years.

Research clearly identifies that children are supported as writers when we engage in rich conversations with them. **Talk is important!**

Take every opportunity to have conversations with your child.

It is also important for Educators to have conversations with students and learn about families and their experiences, so they can build on the students experiences, to support improved rich learning at school.

Working with families talking and listening means we all learn.

What can you do at home to support your child's writing development?

- Build a culture of rich conversations and storytelling at home.
- Be excited and talk about the shared experiences and places you visit.
- Supply resources for writing - **paper, crayons, pencils, pens.....**
- Compose a story with your child when they create a drawing.
- Model the joy of writing and communicating in print - **"Lets make a Birthday card!"**
- Listen to your child read their writing.

At Fraser Park Preschool-7 School, we have been working on positive engagement and fun at recess and lunch.

Through student voice, students indicated that they would like some different activities on offer to increase our school value of **FUN** for students at break times. Through consultation with students we developed a range of activities on offer each recess and lunch such as skipping, music, cricket, dodge ball games, the computer room and the library. Staff have been skilling the older students up to learn new games at break times so they are able to teach and run these games for younger students. This gives the senior students a chance to be a leader and mentor for some of the younger students and creates positive role models. This has been a positive initiative and we have had positive feedback from students often reporting that the games they have played at recess or lunch have been a highlight of their day, when their class shares what they have enjoyed at the end of each day. Staff have also reported that students have been more engaged in their learning and happier after break times.




PULYERI NEWS
