Welcome back to an exciting year of learning at Fraser Park Preschool-7 School. We are continuing our focus on Reading and Oral Language with all teachers focusing on using Guided Reading in classrooms to support reading improvement at Fraser Park. Reading is a really important skill for learning and unlocks learning opportunities in all curriculum areas. All students at Fraser Park read three times a day and are supported through Accelerated Literacy, Guided Reading groups, early years reading program with Kez and the Levelled Literacy Intervention group, with Heather.

Teachers have been working with Leanne Konitska the Speech Pathologist from Support Services to develop and use an Oral Language tracking system for students to track their learning in Oral Language. Oral Language is one of the Big 6 important skills for reading and a foundation skill for writing. We are proud of the improvement in Oral Language that students have had with all of our Junior Primary students showing improvement in learning data.
