Guided Reading

Reading is a major focus at Fraser Park Preschool-7 School. We are continuing to expand our work on reading by improving our Guided Reading Program in classrooms. Anne Hein our Teacher/ Librarian has been working in Wa:nyl with Ms Jackson and Wuldi with Mr Hooper to support guided reading lessons. The students have been working with groups of students on the same level reader with a teacher to improve their reading fluency, comprehension and reading levels. To help support guided reading the school has purchased \$1,200 worth of levelled texts from Oxford that are interesting and contain a range of genres. Guided reading works well and supports the other reading programs at Fraser Park Preschool-7 School.
