The children have been busily drawing and painting animals, doing farm animal crafts and making a mural of *The Little Red Hen* story. During our group times some of the learning experiences we have been engaged in have included finding the front cover, finding where the story starts, determining the start middle and end of the story, joining in with the script of the story and acting it out. In this story the Little Red hen gets a bag of flour made into bread, so we made damper. The



children loved getting involved in this experience and they especially enjoyed eating it during our afternoon snack time.
