# Wellbeing Coordinator Learning

At Fraser Park

Preschool-7 School we are aiming for High Expectations in reading for all students. Reading is one of the most important areas of learning and without the ability to read students are unable to engage with other curriculum and learning areas. We have been setting targets for student learning in reading that push for a years learning for a years teaching. Our targets are based on the Oxford Word List, Running Records Data and PAT R Data. We are aiming for all of our Junior Primary students to improve 50 Site Words by the end of Term 4, and all Primary students to know 100% of their Oxford Site Words (500) by the end of Term 4.

By the end of Term 4 we are aiming for :

- All Reception students to be reading at Level 5 or above.
- All Year 1 students to be reading at Level 13 or above.
- All Year 2 students to be reading at Level 21 or above.
- All students Year 3-7 to be reading at level 26 or above.

To support your child to reach these targets it is really important that you read with them at least 3 times a week. This not only gives them the opportunity to practise at home but also helps by showing that you support and value reading. If you need any support please don't hesitate to ask.


## English: Book Study
