My Paintings Speak For Me


Staff and families participated in a Cultural excursion to the Migration Museum to hear

This fortnight in Pulyeri the children were involved in Dynamo and wind powered generators to create electricity. We used our muscles to turn the generator in the Dynamo and the windmill used wind to turn the generator.
