English: Book Study

This term classes are continuing to study *procedure* writing as part of their English lessons. Procedures are written to teach people how to do something. They can include numbered instructions and drawings or photographs of specific steps. With Fete Day approaching learning to follow procedures to make food or art and craft items is a focus.

They followed the procedure from the Persona Doll Kit "Bush Tucker" to make their own damper. This fortnight the Pulyeri children have been involved in **learning experiences related to the story "My Mum and Dad Make Me Laugh"**. Some children helped design a play scene of a Safari Zoo, for all of the children to play with, they also had opportunities to sequence pictures from the story, make elephant mobiles, label elephant diagrams and make a stripy milkshake collage.



Other learning experiences the children involved themselves with included making spider web decorations, exploring shapes with a rocket craft, making a jumping frog on a lily-pad, which was related to the story **"Tiddalick"** and putting their names on the



Pulyeri Tree.



We have had some beautiful days for outside play as well. When Kungari visited, the children had a fun time involved in creative play and group games, such as games with the parachute. On our really



hot days we put ice in the red tub and the children explored the different properties of ice, noting that it is hard, cold, wet and slippery.
