What a term we have had moving our administration building and library so far. It was a massive effort, and I thank everyone for all the extra work they put in to make the move as smooth as possible. It is nice to have settled into our temporary administration building. It has been great getting used to our new space and being closer to the classrooms, although a little further from the preschool.

We have had two great weeks of learning. The preschool children and Wuldi students took their scarecrows to the Adelaide show. The competition was intense, but the preschool children received two awards. Miss Bec will share more of the good news in her preschool update.

Last week, teachers and SSOs travelled to Tailem Bend Primary School to participate in Big Ideas in Number training. It was an excellent opportunity for staff to work with other teachers and SSOs across the partnership. Staff could analyse their classroom data and learn different activities to support each child's level of understanding.

Over the last four weeks, staff have been undertaking literacy training provided by the Literacy Guarantee Unit. It has been an excellent opportunity for staff to discuss our literacy block and ways to improve our delivery. We were able to look at our intervention programs and learn new activities. These training sessions are linked to our SIP (Site Improvement Plan), supporting our student's learning and engagement in the classroom. We have already achieved one of our literacy goals, which is fantastic.

Our attendance is beginning to increase again. Please remember to contact the school if your child is absent. Let's see how high we can get our average attendance by the end of term 3.

Term 3 week 8 2023

So far this term in Mathematics, Wanyi students have been learning and exploring about different types of measurement, the Metric system and two-dimensional and three-dimensional shapes. For the rest of the term well be looking at lines and angles, location and transformation. A really important part of learning about shapes is developing the ability to recognise and see 3D shapes from different viewpoints and then describe them. Have a look at some of the great work our students did with interpreting some complex shape images and then constructing them themselves.









Another important part of our understanding of 3D shapes is understanding that they are all created from 2D shapes! All of those amazing computer graphics you see in movies like the dinosaurs in Jurassic Park and in any of the Marvel movies have all been made using tiny 2D shapes put together using super powerful software. The special pattern of 2D shapes that can be turned into a 3D shape is called a 'net' have a look at our fantastic results when we had a go ourselves using printed nets on paper.





We will be running individual meetings with parents and students in weeks 9 and 10 this term. Meetings are designed as an opportunity for our staff to gain you and your child's perspective regarding their learning strengths, interests, and areas for development


