

As the *Silly Season* ramps up, so does our stress levels, tolerance and ability to regulate our emotions. The importance of keeping our own mental health in mind during this time is essential. Mental Health is an ongoing process, we must be mindful to keep our filling our own cup to deal effectively with life's stressors, pressures and challenges. If we think of our mental health like a piggy bank, we need to be putting in more than we withdraw to help manage our self-care and stress levels.


Nearly there!




