

Principal's Piece

We are halfway through the term, and the weather has changed. It's fantastic timing as our new school jumpers have arrived. We are almost fully stocked with t-shirts and jumpers. Our year six t-shirts and jumpers arrived this week and look fabulous. It is great to see our senior students wearing the uniforms with pride. We are updating our uniform policy, which I will present at our next governing council meeting in week 8.

Unfortunately, we have had pockets of unsafe behaviour or behaviour that have disrupted the learning of others. We are following the behaviour policy and working closely with families to reduce the number of incidents. On Friday, I held an assembly to inform and talk to students about the behaviours we have been seeing. The students were told that any suspensions from Monday, 3rd June, week 6, would result in the student being unable to attend the Bounce excursion. All students have a fresh start, and we hope to have as many students attending the excursion as possible. The Bounce excursion is Friday, 28th June, week 9.

In week 8 we have our next Student Free Day which will be our second day of Berry St training. This training, with its focus on relationships, is a crucial part of our ongoing commitment to student development. As part of our training, I have participated in a leader's workshop. The focus for Fraser Park in these workshops is updating our Student Behaviour Management Policy. We will take our learning from Berry St and use this to update the policy. This will occur over the next two years as we have two more Berry St days to complete in 2025. I will provide updates as we review the policy. cy.

Our students have been involved in many fantastic learning opportunities this term, and we couldn't be more excited to share them with you. The reception to year twos has been completing Auskick sessions Friday afternoon with Flash. This week, our year three to six students will have four football clinics run by the SANFL. Our preschool, reception to year two students had a visit from the tooth fairy, our year four to six students get to preview MBHS School of Rock on Wednesday and our reception to year two students got to participate in a Grug workshop before watching the performance at the (town hall). We still have a lot of things to pack in before the end of term.

Wellbeing Corner

National Reconciliation Week


The National Reconciliation Week 2024, theme, *Now More Than Ever*, is a reminder to all of us that no matter what, the fight for justice and the rights of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people will – and must – continue.

Fraser Park students have been reflecting and learning more about our shared histories, cultures and the dreaming stories. The theme emphasises the need for respect, connection, decisive action, urging all Australians to act towards meaningful change and the ongoing journey of reconciliation.

Students have read and listened to stories about The Hawkesbeak Turtle and Bip the Snapping Bungaroo. These stories are beautifully illustrated and featuring native Australian fauna. Bip the Snapping Bungaroo is a special story that highlights the importance of friendship, communication and teamwork.

The preschool's Thukubi (Murray short-necked turtle) came to visit and students talked about its features and colours. They then made their own Thukubi with their own special designs.









This term in Mathematics we have begun sequence of learning about addition and subtraction. Our focus has been around adding and subtracting zero, counting on, counting back, making ten, doubling and several other counting strategies to help solve worded problems. To assist you in supporting your child's learning here is some of the language we will be using and their meanings.

Part: An element of an equation (number sentence) that makes up a whole, for example, in 6 + 8 = 14, the 6 and 8 are the parts, while 14 is the whole.

Whole: A number sentence or equation is made up of parts and a whole. In the equation 3 + 5 = 8, 8 is the whole as it is the sum of the two parts.

Number sentence: Also known as an equation, a statement that asserts that two mathematical expressions are equal in value. A number sentence must include an equal sign.

Equal: Exactly the same amount or value. The symbol is =.

Subitising: Recognising the number in small collections without counting.

Partitioning: Physically separating or renaming a collection in terms of its parts, for example 110 can be partitioned into one hundred and one ten.

Commutative: Operations are commutative if the order in which terms are given does not affect the result.
